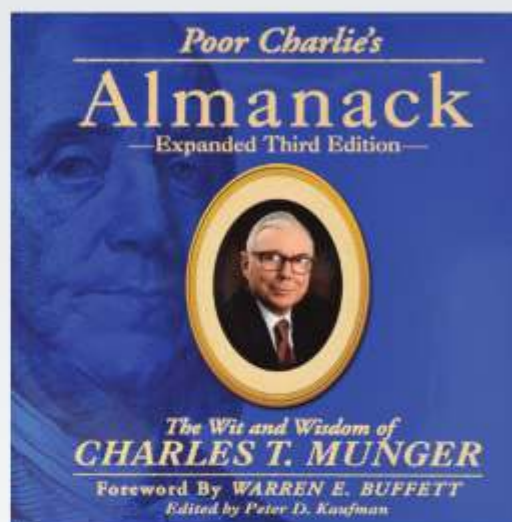

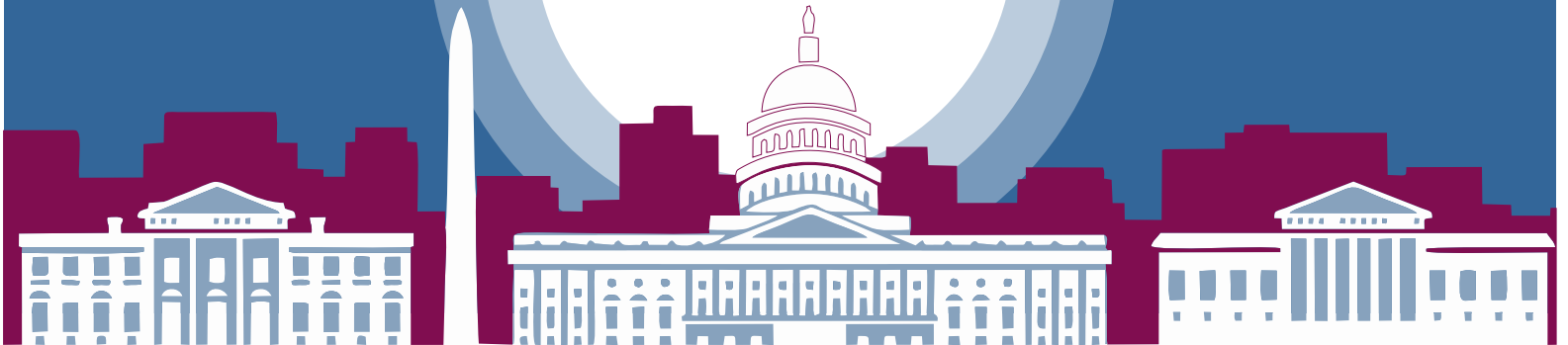

From Sojourner to Citizen 從過客到公民

2018 Chinese Americans Convention Manifesto (2018美國華人大會宣言)

Washington, DC. September 28, 2018

Rooted in one of the oldest uninterrupted civilizations, we, the Chinese Americans, like immigrants from all other nations, have come to the United States of America to seek our American dreams. We too believe in the American creed that "All men are created equal".

Our journey in this Land of Free has been rife with opposition and adversities. Blamed as the "Yellow Peril (黃禍)", labeled as "perpetual foreigners", and being outcasts under the Chinese Exclusion Act for over half a century, our Chinese American pioneers persevered through their trials to uphold and contribute to the core values of the United States. We forged the foundation of the West coast during the gold rush, built the most dangerous sections of the transcontinental railroad, fought side by side with other Americans in World War I and World War II, and produced many revolutionary scientists, including 7 Nobel Prize winners.

While many outstanding Chinese Americans have become leaders in academic, architectural, engineering, sports, entertainment, business, legal, medical, and political fields, our Chinese American community as a whole has not actively engaged in the political and civic life of America. Our voice at the local and national stages remains weak and whispery. Many of us still subconsciously consider ourselves to be "sojourners (過客)" in this country, rather than fellow citizens.

Change is on the horizon. The rise of China has brought about growing anxiety and unbridled promise. At the same time, the United States is becoming a nation without a majority race. This demographic shift will change the political landscape. The Chinese American community is facing a new challenge and a historical opportunity. Internationally, we can play a critical role in promoting friendship between the two peoples and enhancing communication and understanding between the two countries. Domestically, we must protect our civil rights and contribute to a multi-ethnic democracy with our unique Chinese American experiences and cultural heritage.

We can only achieve that goal through active civic engagement and character building based on the best values of both Chinese and American cultures. While the "sojourner" mentality was a result of the historical mistreatment of Chinese people in America, it is up to us now to overcome such backward thinking and to fulfill our civic duties. We must transform from sojourners to citizens.

It is no longer enough for us to merely be recognized as a model minority by the mainstream society. We must participate in all aspects of civic life and help define the mainstream society.

It is no longer sufficient to sit on the sidelines while other minorities initiate activities to further the advancement of our nation. We must advocate for the common interests of the Chinese American community alongside with other minorities to secure a brighter and more prosperous future for our children.

It is no longer acceptable to be isolated from the mainstream society. We must join the political process and ingrain ourselves within the fabric of American society to fight for the interests of all Americans.

UCA is dedicated to building a united front of all Chinese American individuals and organizations and promoting civic engagement, political participation, heritage sharing, youth development and a greater understanding between the U.S. and China.

America is a nation of immigrants. Diversity is her strength. We must learn to protect our differences while seeking common interests (護異尋同). Indeed, achieving a multi-ethnic democracy in a pluralistic society is not only a triumph of all Americans; it is a milestone of humanity.

We must carry out this mission with a unified voice. United, we are strong! United, we make history!

Empower Communities & Impact Tomorrow

United Chinese Americans (UCA) is a nationwide non-profit and nonpartisan federation of organizations and individuals dedicated to empowering Chinese American communities through civic participation, political engagement, heritage sharing, and youth development for the wellbeing of all Americans.

Sponsored by the Civic Leadership USA (CLUSA) and other future grant-giving institutions, Civil Leadership USA (CLUSA) aims to train Asian Americans to fully participate in America's civic and political life by creating a pipeline for its leaders for a representative democracy and a just society. Traditionally, Asian Americans have been underrepresented in the political sphere on both the local levels and national stages. It is therefore critical for each of us to be part of the solution by developing such future leaders. Our goal is to unite our community across the country, to empower our civic and political leaders. We hope to light the fire, rally the troop, and march on to build better communities and more perfect Union of both today and tomorrow.

In the fall of 2017, with the generous support from the CLUSA, UCA successfully organized four Civic Leadership USA conferences in Milwaukee, Twin Cities, Chicago and Salt Lake City, based on the understanding that what Chinese American community need most is much more civic engagement. These events drew a combined total of 250 community activists, civic leaders, and youth. In 2018, 4 more forums are planned for Iowa, Philadelphia, North Carolina, and Texas. UCA will continue to engage our community nationwide on this fundamental issue as one of its highest priorities.

Political Engagement

Defending Civil Rights, Protecting Community Interest

From day one of its inception, UCA has taken defending civil rights as another of its high priorities. UCA has been a national leader in helping and defending Sherry Chen and Xiaoxing Xi, two Chinese American scientists who were falsely charged with espionage related crimes. UCA has also come to

the help of Xiyue Wang and his family, a PhD student of Princeton University, who was put in jail on trumped up charges by Iranian government. From organizing a coalition of 14 national Asian American organizations to repudiate FBI Director Wray's troubling statement, to exposing unlawful profiling by government, to advocating reform for FISA during its reauthorization, to fighting the latest reincarnation of China paranoid, UCA has been unabashedly a national leader, fighting to protect and advance our community's common interest.



Celebrating Heritage

And Charitable Lunar New Year Initiative

Heritage, identity, and Chinese American way of life are a big part of what UCA stands for. UCA has a range of programs in this area, from Interactive Chinese American Heritage Map to Transcontinental Railroad Memorial Projects. UCA believes that in a pluralistic society such as ours, each culture or ethnic community offers something unique to enhance the beauty and strength of America.

Since 2017 its inception, UCA has launched "Chinese Lunar New Year Initiative" to instill and enhance charitable giving and public service spirit to the traditional holiday celebration. Over 600 people from Chicago and San Francisco enjoyed making Jiaozi together, and donating foods and money to local food banks and other charities. The event was highlighted by mainstream media.



Youth Development: Leadership

Asian American Leadership Institute & "Future Leaders" Program

UCA has established "Asian American Leadership Institute" to address the dire need of training Chinese and Asian Americans in a full range of areas, from leadership training, to how to be more civically engaged; from how to run campaigns such as local school board, to how to run non profit organizations. The thrust or priority of this institute will be training Asian American young generation on how to improve leadership skills and capacity. "Future Leaders" is a very first DC-based one week training program of the Institute to focus on developing leadership capacity of the younger generation. Specifically, it is to find, train and track the most motivated Asian American youth, typically high school junior or seniors, who have demonstrated leadership or public service track record.

Youth Development: Mental Health

Asian Parents, American Children

In April 2017, UCA IL organized "Asian Parents, American Children" conference, addressing the emotional needs and mental health issues prevalent among Asian American youth. The conference drew 250 participants. Overwhelmingly positive verbal/written feedbacks validate the urgent needs of our community for programs that can help our youth and family.

On a related issue concerning our youth and parents, Asian/Chinese American students are often at high risk for

being bullied, which could lead to severe mental illness, identity confusion, and low self esteem. A "Get Serious about Anti-bullying" forum was attended by about 200 participants in Chicago, and was supported by DCFS and over 15 local Chinese American organizations.

Teach in China

UCA Teach-in-China is a program that UCA and Ameson Foundation collaborate to offer an opportunity for recent college graduates from families of UCA community to experience. The program strives to help them expand their horizon and enhance their careers by spending one academic year (ten months) of teaching, learning and globalizing. It is a unique way for young college graduates to explore the world they are interested in, as well as learn and gain a deeper understanding of China, its language and culture. It could also serve as a gap year for them. Those young people will serve as cultural and educational ambassadors to nurture better understanding between the people of these two countries — one of the missions that UCA is committed to fulfill. UCA is now seeking future leaders to fulfill that mission.

Youth Volunteerism and Community Service

With its motto "serve, lead, inspire!", UCA IL chapter conducted multiple service projects with over 100 high school and parent volunteers. Service projects include taking 45 seniors to performing arts events, and helping organize an open-air concert with over 10,000 attendees.
